Search Techniques: Field Searching

Records in electronic databases and library catalogues have fields and subfields to display information of the item concerned. We can search these fields to look for resources that is relevant to our needs.

Search Techniques: Field Searching: Benefits

Most databases provide drop down menus for fields in a record e.g. author, title, publisher, etc. The selection of fields differ for each database.

Benefits of searching by field:

Search results are more specific e.g. if we know the author's name we can search according to "Author".

Normally in the Advanced Search various fields can be searched simultaneously coupled with the use of Boolean Operators to result in more precise results.

If we do not specify the field, the search results will be too many for us to sift through.

Sometimes fewer but relevant results are more helpful than too many results.





Search Techniques: Phrase Searching

Different databases search phrases differently.

- The phrase is searched with the words in the order they are typed into the search box.
- 2. A Boolean "AND" is automatically placed between words in the phrase. That means all the words must be present in the search result but not necessarily in order they are typed into search box.
- 3. Phrase searching can be done in Simple, Advanced and Guided Search.

Example from EBSCOhost User Guide

- 1. Stop words (e.g. the, for, of and after) are replaced by any other one word. If you enter 2 stop words then they will be automatically replaced by any other 2 words.
- 2. Using quotation marks ("") will inform the database to give priority to this command (stop words in phrase will still be ignored). Even if one word in the phrase is in a field it will still override field searching. It will also override "Find All My Search Terms" command.

Search Techniques: Phrase Searching: Using Proximity Operators

Using proximity operators in phrase search for more precision compared to Boolean.

Common proximity operators:

w# = with

With specifies that words are searched in the order they are typed in.

can be replaced by any number to state number of words in between phrase words.

e.g. stem w cell searches stem cell

Hillary w2 Clinton gets results Hillary Clinton, Hillary Rodham Clinton and Clinton Hillary Rodham in any field of a record.
